## HOW TO GET INVOLVED

### Volunteer

Due to COVID-19, volunteering will be different this year. We will not be collecting and sorting food on Friday evening. We are committed to having a safe event for both our volunteers and the families we serve.

As we get closer, there will be sign-ups available for families or social bubble groups that can volunteer together safely. Schedules will be created to allow safe sorting of toys and distribution food and toys. Masks will be required of anyone who is volunteering.

### Donate

### Collect Donations

Barrels are available for businesses. Please contact Jeff Schults at 925-890-8296 to see if a barrel can be set-up at your location. Barrels are delivered during the first week of November and collected a week prior to distribution.

Arrangements can be made to empty overflowing barrels in the interim.

### How to get Assistance

Families in need can apply to participate at one of the scheduled sign-up events listed below. Sign-ups will be socially distanced and outdoors. There are a limited number of participants and families are encouraged to sign up early. All spaces may fill up prior to all sign-up events being held. Families must live in Brentwood, Byron, Discovery Bay, Knightsen or Bethel Island. Applicants need to show proof of identity and residence; (Driver's License or ID card and utility bill, PG & E, Phone, water or garbage, etc.). Masks required.
